- 1. A newly elected state Senator rallies colleagues around a bill that would invest in new bike lanes in low-income neighborhoods.
- 2. A large electric company creates a program that would subsidize energy efficiency upgrades for homeowners via reductions in monthly utility bills.
- 3. A remote town is selected for a solar-powered microgrid project that would bring reliable electricity to the rural area.
- 4. Entry level workers at an auto-parts manufacturer petition executives to install "living curtains" made up of edible flowers and greens on the factory façade.
- 5. A DC-based non-profit deploys a team to the US Virgin Islands to service private generators in preparation for hurricane season.
- 6. The pastor of a Black Church organizes the neighborhood to turn an abandoned lot into a community garden.
- 7. A country in the Global South works with an NGO on a large-scale reforestation project in the vicinity of rural villages.
- 8. A community elder enlists the help of less advantaged youth to build a school using reclaimed materials; she then teaches them about nutritious diets and the benefits of gardening.
- 9. After closing for weeks due to no electricity after damage suffered from a hurricane, a school switches to 100% solar power.
- 10. The Burlington Electric Department, a municipal utility, adopts new incentive programs for electric vehicle owners.
- 11. A women-lead initiative builds irrigation ditches to bring water closer to a rural village, allowing women and girls more time for education.



- 12. With travel slowed due to COVID-19, a small mountain nation uses the opportunity to switch transportation infrastructure from car to rail.
- 13. In Fiji, the Pacific Conference of Churches (PCC) establishes a "Peace Garden" to tackle food insecurity and climate change.
- 14. The City Council approves funding for a Community Food Hub with a demonstration kitchen, garden, job training, and more.
- 15. Teachers at an elementary school serving impoverished youth pool resources to start a school garden for experiential learning.
- 16. A school district makes its buildings more energy efficient and uses part of the savings from lower utility bills to buy EV school buses.
- 17. A national-level environmental advocacy group sends engineers to restore an area of coastline that is rapidly disappearing near a fishing community.
- 18. A government project in Nairobi, Kenya employs 100+ current & former houseless folks to clean, green, and maintain public parks.
- 19. A Rabbi begins a city-wide initiative in which volunteers work with various community leaders to design and build edible orchards.
- 20. The state-run electric company begins a multi-pronged program to both subsidize homeowners' utility bills and green their energy sources.
- 21. A city government funds a Climate Resilience Corps which will provide employment for job-insecure youth for up to 3 years.
- 22. Farmers in Jamaica start a cooperative grocery store and community garden where they can pool resources for lower consumer prices.



- 23. A city ordinance is passed to close certain streets to traffic on Sundays so folks can bike and walk the area safely.
- 24. A province in India adopts a carbon tax and plans to use the revenue to help fossil fuel companies transition to cleaner energy sources.
- 25. Aid workers in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia educate parents on dangers of indoor coal burning and help educate them about alternatives and train local women in repairing solar lanterns.
